Salisbury – Sudan partnership

This started in 1972 in order to develop mutual prayer and fellowship. Its roots lie in local deanery links with the dioceses of the Episcopal Church in Sudan and South Sudan (ECSSS). The link is sustained and developed by ongoing dialogue, Christian fellowship, and practical support.

Bradford Deanery Link with the Kadugli Diocese

Our Bradford Deanery is linked with the Kadugli Diocese in the Nuba Mountains region. It is within Sudan and borders South Sudan.

The Kadugli Deanery has supported a number of valuable projects including help towards Grace School and ongoing support for the church.

How we can get involved

Sudan and South Sudan both continue to suffer from turbulence, violence and, at times, intense suffering. Leading to the tragedy of millions being displaced within their country or in neighbouring countries.

A group from our deanery helped run a 'Rooted in Jesus' conference in Kadugli in 2019. These opportunities for short term mission are dependent on the security situation and are limited. The most important thing we can do is pray. The monthly Kadugli newsletter and prayer diary sent out by the Bradford Deanery Secretary is a valuable source for up-to-date information and prayer pointers.
